#### Diane Koutsulis

Diane Koutsulis has recently retired as the Director of Bands and Arts Department Chair at Green Valley High School. From Chicago, Diane has been teaching in Las Vegas for 35 years. She received a BA in Music from Western Illinois University. After teaching junior high band in Oswego, Illinois, for three years, she went on to complete the MMEd at Louisiana State University, where she studied with Frank Wickes.

During her tenure in Las Vegas, Diane has built fine band programs at both Las Vegas High School (1982-91) and Green Valley High School (1991-2017). Her groups have consistently garnered recognition for fine performances, and she has served as guest clinician and conductor at various conferences and honor bands throughout the US. Diane was named the 1999 Nevada Teacher of the Year and received the 1999 Milken Family Foundation National Educator Award. In 2004, the GVHS Symphonic Band performed at the Midwest Clinic in Chicago, IL. The Green Valley High School Marching Band performed in the 2010 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City, as well as the 2009 and 1993 Presidential Inaugural Parades. Diane is honored to be a member of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association (ABA).

#### **Javier Sosa**



Javier Sosa lives in Reno, Nevada where he is currently the Program Coordinator/Color Guard caption head at Damonte Ranch High School. He began his judging career with Marching Band Open Series and West Texas Color Guard Circuit in 2014. Javier has served as Program Coordinator/Choreographer/Color Guard Director for winter guards, marching bands and drum corps in Florida, Pennsylvania and Nevada. In the Winter Guard activity, he has produced Winter Guard International finalists and Winter Guard Association of Southern California finalists and champions. As a performer he marched with the Drum Corp International World Champions the Cadets of Bergen County.



## **Adjudicators**



#### **Brian Mora**

Brian Mora is visual consultant from Miami, FL, and has been involved in the marching arts for over 25 years. He is an accomplished instructor/consultant/adjudicator throughout the US. Brian has had the honor of working with several of the top drum corps, marching bands, winterguards, indoor percussion units, and winds at all levels of activity. His affiliations include WGI, DCI, USBands, WBA, TCGC, FMBC, ADLA and many others.

From the beginning, Brian has been a proponent of the positive lessons and effects the activity can have on its members. He continues to provide all levels, organizations, and their students with the tools to reach the pinnacle of their abilities. Brian currently resides in Roseville, CA. His continued message, "The Marching Arts are a sport, an art, and an education in life."



J.W. Koester has served as director or manager with several top-tier corps such as: Phantom Regiment during the 2008 DCI World Championship season, Santa Clara Vanguard during the 1999 DCI World Championship season, Vanguard Cadets during the 1991 and 1993 Division II finalist seasons, and most recently as the Corps Director for Spirit of Atlanta. He also worked with Drum Corps International (DCI) as the national coordinator for Division II & III corps. In 2018, he was inducted into the Santa Clara Vanguard Hall of Fame.

In his 30 years as a designer, instructor and consultant, Koester has worked with performing ensembles throughout eight states. A percussionist since 1967, he has performed with groups including the Santa Clara Vanguard (winning three DCI World Championships and five Best Percussion Section Awards), the San Jose State University Marching Band, the West Valley College Wind and Percussion Ensembles, and numerous community theater musical productions. Koester is currently Lead Instructor for the Price Charter School Winter Percussion Ensemble, Percussion Coordinator for Oak Grove High School Marching Band and Winter Percussion Ensemble, and also a Project Engineer with a semi-conductor capital equipment company.



## Classification and Scoring



#### Classification & Performance Order

Class A: 1-60 Total Performers Class AA: 61-75 Total Performers Class AAA: 76-90 Total Performers Class AAAA: 91+ Total Performers

Total number of members is the sum of all performers: woodwind, brass, percussion, front ensemble, guard/auxiliary and drum major(s).

At the discretion of the band director, bands may move up to any division, but not down a division.

Performance order by class is determined by blind and random draw.

#### Scoring

Bands will receive a score based on a total possible 100 points computed to the nearest tenth of a point.

DMI will be utilizing the Western Band Association (WBA) Class 1-2-3 A score sheets.

The percentage of the total score for each caption is:

- Music Effect: 30% (10% Program/10% Performance/10% Coordination)
- **Visual Effect: 30%** (10% Program/10% Performance/10% Coordination)
- Ensemble Music: 20% (5% Balance & Timing/5% Tone Quality and Intonation/10% Musicianship)
- **Visual Ensemble: 20%** (10% Program/10% Performance/10% Coordination)

**Music Effect:** Music General Effect is the utilization of all elements to bring about maximum effectiveness of the musical performance. Evaluation is done on what is being performed simultaneously with how well it is performed. Since achievement is judged, this judge must understand that the construction and content of a program, in combination with the performance level, which is being demonstrated, will determine the achievement level. The music General Effect sheet has two sub-captains: Effectiveness of the repertoire and Effectiveness of the performers.

**Visual Effect:** Visual General Effect is the utilization of all elements to bring about maximum effectiveness the visual representation of the music performance. Evaluation is done on what is being performed simultaneously with how it is being performed. Since achievement is judged, this judge must understand that the construction and content of a program, in combination with the performance level, which is being demonstrated, will determine the achievement level. The Visual General Effect sheet has two sub-captains: Effectiveness of the Repertoire and Effectiveness of the Performers.

**Music Ensemble:** The purpose and evaluation on this sheet is to determine the best, second best, etc. musical performance based on accuracy and uniformity of a performance as perceived from the vantage point of the audience. The judgement of technical accuracy, intonation accuracy and tone quality is to be made with the consideration of content – that is, demand and exposure of the performers. The effectiveness of the production is not to be considered. The Ensemble Music sheet has two sub-captains: Achievement of Musicianship and Sound/Tuning/Technique.

**Visual Ensemble:** The purpose of evaluation in this captain is to determine the most technically proficient marching group from the vantage point of the audience. The evaluation is composed of excellence identification, balanced with the judgement of technical demand, and the exposure to that demand on ensemble, with the consideration of content and construction. The effectiveness of the performance is not to be considered. The Visual Ensemble sheet has two sub-captains: Composing and Achievement of Excellence and Technique.




